



Phlebotomy

Course Description

The mission of the Phlebotomy Program is to provide technical and skill development to enable the students to become successful upon the completion of the program. The curriculum includes classroom study and supervised clinical practice in hospitals. The Phlebotomy student must complete the prescribed course of study and clinical experience to receive a certificate. The course prepares the student to take the National Certification Exam.

The purpose of the Phlebotomy Program is to train or retrain students in drawing blood via venipuncture or skin puncture and to provide experiences which allow the student to acquire basic competencies for employment as a Phlebotomist.

Admission Requirements:

- Must be 18 years of age
- Complete a TTCM Application
- Provide a regular high school diploma or GED transcript
- Pass the required entrance exam
- Provide a regular high school diploma or GED transcript
- Provide letters of reference
- Physical exam with proof of TB test and required immunizations
- Personal Interview

Students are subject to drug screening and a criminal background check based upon clinical affiliation agreements.

Clinical Training—Each student will participate in a minimum of six (6) weeks of clinical training. The hours of operation in each medical facility will vary; therefore, the students must be flexible and willing to meet the assigned schedule. Each student's schedule is designed to provide maximum training experiences within a particular medical facility.

About the Center...

The Tennessee Technology Center at Murfreesboro is located near the geographical center of the state, just off of Interstate 24 and the intersection of State Highways 96 and 99. The Center is governed by the Tennessee Board of Regents and is accredited by the Commission of the Council on Occupational Education.

The Center offers a variety of programs to fill demonstrated needs in the local community. Our students come from Rutherford and all the surrounding counties. The instructors are all professionals in the fields in which they teach and several have been recognized statewide and nationally.

Full-time preparatory classes are scheduled five days a week for six hours a day. In addition to full-time day classes, supplemental classes are offered each term. A new evening schedule is prepared for each term.

The calendar of the Tennessee Technology Center at Murfreesboro is based on three equal trimesters that include a minimum of 216 instructional days. The three trimesters are:
Fall—September, October, November, December
Spring—January, February, March, April
Summer—May, June, July, August
